


Class dojo


Tuesday folders



- Graded work (1,2, 3, 4) should be reviewed by the parent and discussed with the student. This allows for consistency and communication from school to home.
- Graded work must be signed and returned as soon as possible. We need the work for our records.
- All work with a P means practice and does not need to be returned.
- Folders need to be returned for the following week.

Reader's Workshop Reading workshop (mini-lesson, modeling,

independent work, sharing)



- responding to text using reading strategies (Edmodo, reading journal, sticky notes)
- CAFE (reading strategies)
- Confer with students and create personalized goals
- strategy groups (when skills need to be reinforced)
- leveled books (student choice within the levels)
- Achieve 3000- differentiated reading passages based on exile level.

Writer's Workshop

- Mini lesson
- Seed journal-encourage students to record ideas in their seed journal once they occur in their daily lives
- confer with student
- peer editing
- Kidblogs (published work)- only those with the password can access. Teacher monitors comments.

Math

- Differentiated activities (challenge, remediation)

Standard Based Grading



- <u>Level 1:</u> The student does not show an understanding of the material. They struggle performing tasks with help.
- <u>Level 2</u>: The student can perform task with help and occasionally on their own.
- <u>Level 3</u>: The student consistently performs tasks without assistance.
- Level 4: The student CONSISTENTLY makes connections between the concept and the outside world. The student consistently adds insight and depth to the answers in all subject areas.
